6. PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS

Greg Edwards – "Catch Des Moines" Greater Des Moines CVB was on hand to provide an annual update. Edwards mentioned that the mission of the CVB is to increase visitors to the metro area, thereby positively affecting economic growth. Edwards stated that the CVB had an outstanding year and highlighted the many events the metro area played the host city for including a host site for the first weekend of the Men's NCAA basketball tournament, among many others. The CVB's funding comes from 15 communities that pay 2/7 of all hotel / motel tax as private partners. Edwards stated that there are four (4) main areas of focus including: meetings and conventions; sporting market; leisure travel and locals.

Trees Please Grant Award – A representative from Mid-American Energy was present to award the City with a check for \$5,000.00 on behalf of the Trees Please grant program.

Sheila Manteaw from 6100 Trace Court in Johnston requested that the Council reconsider the No Parking sign to be placed in her front yard. She mentioned that she wrote a formal complaint and that she did not want it right in the view of her front window. She requested reconsideration of placing it on the other side of the street. She also mentioned she has a stop sign in her front yard as well.

There was some further discussion regarding placement and the Mayor concluded the discussion by stating the issue would be examined further.

Senior Planner Aaron Wolfe introduced the item. Wolfe went over the history of the zoning in the area and for this particular property. Wolfe stated that some of the C-2 area was lost due to the roundabout right-of-way. This request will help regain some of that area, which also necessitated a new development agreement to make sure the entire area is covered in the restricted uses. Wolfe stated that this was a relatively simple rezoning, merely adjusting a line between C-2 and R-3.

Director of Finance Teresa Rotschafer continued where she left off with the budget presentation from the work session and indicated that the levy rate as published remains the same from last year. Rotschafer continued with the presentation and discussed percentages of revenues; the City's tax rate compared to the consolidated tax rate with other taxing entities; comparison of other metro communities levy rates; historical levies, etc. There will be a projected \$29.94 per year addition to the taxes of a \$200,000 residential home for City taxes only due entirely to the roll back, and a commercial building would have no change.

Mayor Dierenfeld and Councilmember Cope thanked Teresa and all who worked well, and responsibly together to be fiscally responsible. Mayor Dierenfeld mentioned she would like to see the Council seriously consider having the levy lowered to the \$11.39 rate
